What is his identity? How does his life change in 1933?</p>	<p>Create a British newspaper article in reaction to Hitler becoming chancellor in January 1933. Including:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • German Jewish life before his appointment as Chancellor • Bernard and Rudi's life • The problems Germany has experienced since World War I • How he is wrong to blame Jewish people for these problems. <p>This can be done on paper or using the computer.</p>

What impact did propoganda have on Jewish children?</p>	<p>Use with The Journey App after exploring the Leo's street and school.</p>	<p>You will learn all about what Leo was experiencing at School:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Identify the ways Leo was treated differently to other children • Describe how the Nazis encouraged antisemitism using propoganda • Explain why it is important to combat propoganda in our world today <p>Key thinking point: What do we do if we see Propoganda and racism today? Why is it important to speak out against it?</p>	<p>Create a poster to help people identify and stop propoganda being shared in your community and online. Including:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • How to identify propoganda and hatred. • Why it is harmful and impact it has to individuals and communities. • What to do about it. <p>This can be done on paper or using the computer.</p>

What was Leo's journey and why was it important?</p>	<p>Use with The Journey App after exploring the November pogrom and Kindertransport.</p>	<p>You will learn all about Leo and the decision to go on the Kindertransport:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Identify the events that led to Leo having to leave his home. • Describe these events and the impact they had on Jewish families. • Explain the importance of Leo's journey and why people make similar journeys today. 	<p>You will write a letter to Leo's friends explaining why he has been sent to England.</p> <p>This can be done:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • On paper • As a presentation on your iPad. • On the computer.

Use after completing The Journey App	<p>You will learn all about different survivor stories:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Identify and listen to the stories of Kindertransport children. • Describe the journey, what they brought with them and who looked after them. • Explain what was difficult about the experience for the Kindertransport children. <p>Key thinking point: Why is it important for survivors to share their stories?</p>	<p>Create a final diary entry for Leo's diary. It must include what the Kindertransport children might have taken with them to England, who looked after them and what the children found very different about the UK.</p> <p>This can be done:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • On paper • As a presentation on your iPad. • On the computer.
